



Reporting Your Wages to SSA

- Reporting your wages is important to avoid overpayments from Social Security.
- You should update Social Security about your wages, when
 - You start or stop work
 - You already reported your work, but your duties, hours, or pay have changed
 - You start paying for expenses that you need for work due to your disability. For more information, refer to the Impairment-Related Work Expenses document <https://choosework.ssa.gov/Assets/cw/files/FAQ-impairment-related-work-expenses.pdf>
- You should report your wages within the **first 6 days** of the calendar month for the income you earned the previous month.

How do I Report my Wages?

There are several ways you can do this:

- **Online:** You can create a free my Social Security account to use the online wage reporting tool, whether you receive SSI, or SSDI. Visit this website to get started: <https://www.ssa.gov/myaccount/>
- **Mobile App:** If you receive SSI, you can download the SSI Wage Reporting app onto your smartphone, which allows you to easily report your wages.
- **Telephone Wage Reporting:** If you receive SSI, you may be able to report your monthly wages over the phone. Please contact your local Social Security office to see if this option can work for you.
- **Your Local Social Security Field office:** You can take copies of your pay stubs to your local field office or mail them to the If you mail in your pay stubs, certified mail is recommended, which does have a cost. Find your local office here <https://secure.ssa.gov/ICON/main.jsp>
